It is mandatory for the participant to come in the Youth Exchange too!

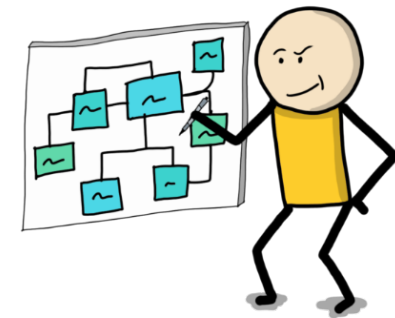
Participants: 18-26 years old

- In the rooms will be provided sheets, towels and soap.

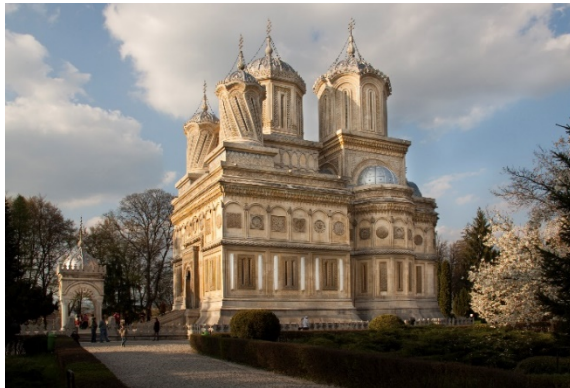


VENUE

Corbeni is a village 15 km away of Curtea de Argeș, on the road to the mountains.

Curtea de Argeș is the first capital of Romania situated on the left bank of the Argeș River, which flows through a beautiful valley from Făgăras Mountains to the Danube river. The town is famous for Cathedral of Curtea de Argeș, which was built in the early 16th century and for a beautiful medieval church build in 14th century.

Being so close to the mountains, the city is a mandatory visit place for tourist who want to drive on one of the most amazing roads in the world, to see a crazy dam or just to enjoy the nature of the mountains.





HOW TO REACH US?

The closest and most accessible airport to the town is Henri Coandă International Airport, also known as Otopeni, Bucharest. Once you are here, you can take the bus to arrive in the city. There are two busses that might interest you:

1. The 780 Express line connects Bucharest Henri Coandă International Airport with the Gara de Nord (main railway station).

2. The 783 Express line connects Bucharest Henri Coandă International Airport with the city center.

FROM BUCHAREST TO CORBENI

First, you have to arrive in Curtea de Argeş (2-3 hours)

1. By train (please note that trains in Romania are not the fastest and modern ones, but they work!)

From Curtea de Argeş, you have 15 km more. There are busses to Corbeni every 30 minutes, but most probably, we will try to pick you up.

TRAVEL COSTS AND REIMBURSEMENT

Maximum budget for transportation:

- Hungary – 180 euro
- Netherlands – 275 euro
- Italy – 275 euro
- Greece – 275 euro
- Spain – 360 euro
- Portugal – 360 euro



TRAVEL COSTS AND REIMBURSEMENT

For reimbursement you will need the following documents:

1. **Flight tickets** (economic class/low cost if possible) – all the following are needed:
 - E-ticket (you receive it by e-mail after you buy the flight);
 - Fiscal invoice (ask your travel agency or check on the website where you buy the ticket how can you get a fiscal invoice). The invoice can be issued on the name of traveler, or on the name of the organization you represent;
 - Boarding Passes (you get it online and print it at home before the flight or directly in the airport);
2. **Train tickets** (make sure the date, the itinerary and the price are visible on the ticket, if you can get an invoice is even better);
3. **Bus tickets** (make sure the date, the itinerary and the price are visible on the ticket, if you can get an invoice it is better);
4. Fuel or Taxi receipts (including Bla Bla car, Uber and such) – will **not** be reimbursed;
5. Please note that additional services on your bookings will **not** be reimbursed (extra leg room in the plane, checked-in bags, additional bags etc.)

INSURANCE

Procuring a medical insurance valid during your stay in Romania is your own responsibility. European Union citizens are entitled to have a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) which you can get for free from your health authorities and you can use in Romania and in any other EU country as well. Anyway, you can also choose a private insurance for the duration of your stay (it should not cost more than 10 EUR depending on the provider and issuing country). Although it might be not mandatory to enter Romania, if you choose to not have a health insurance you need to be ready to cover any medical related cost. **We strongly encourage you to get a medical insurance for your stay!**



INTERCULTURAL NIGHTS

For the intercultural evenings, we kindly ask you to prepare interactive presentation of your country. You can present it along with your food and drinks, music, traditional dances, etc. You can do it in the way you think is more suitable for the group, so be as creative as you want. You are more than welcome to bring traditional food and drinks for this evenings. You can also bring your flag, posters, postcards, leaflets or any kind of gift you want to give to the participants in order them to have a picture of where you come from. Videos or games are also a good idea to be implemented during that night!



WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU?

- You will have to prepare for the Youth Exchange some materials, one workshop (it will be discussed in APV) and 2-3 energizers.
- Anything you need for the intercultural night (food, drinks, brochures etc.)
- Comfortable clothes for the activities outside and inside the conference room;
- One laptop per team;
- Any medicine you think you need;
- Anything you think you will need during your stay in Romania and, of course, GOOD MOOD!

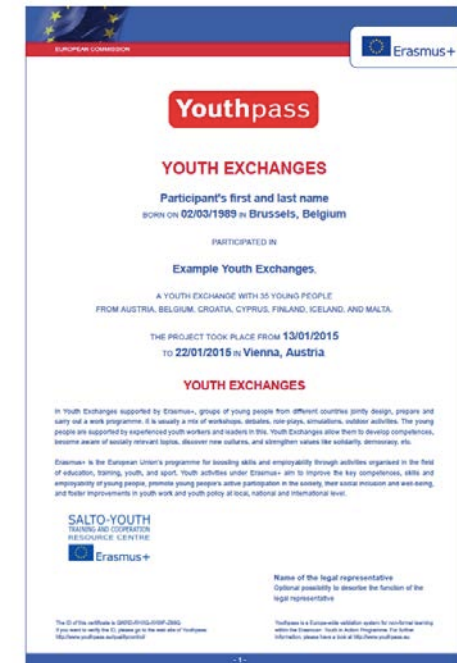


OTHER
