A1 – Training Course

Slettestrand, Denmark

Call for Participants

Together with our partner organisations, we are looking for participants from Denmark, Italy, Spain, Croatia, Germany, Romania, United Kingdom, Hungary, and Turkey for a Training Course within the project "Keep It Real!".

*The activity will take place between **15 November – 24 November 2021** in Slettestrand, Denmark.*

Activity Summary

The project is co-funded through the programme Erasmus+, KA1 – Mobility of Youth Workers and addresses the need of youth workers in the partner organisations to be more conscious members of the society by being able to criticise what they read, hear or watch in the news and to take effort to analyse an issue from different point of views.

The objectives of the activity are as follows:

- 1) To improve youth workers competences in media literacy
- 2) To deepen youth workers' understanding upon the meaning and effects of fake news
- 3) To provide youth workers with tools and methods upon how to identify fake news
- 4) To equip youth workers with the skill of debating in an open manner
- 5) To deepen youth workers' understanding upon non-formal education and how to utilise it in media literacy education.

The objectives will be addressed by gathering 30 participants from 9 organisations to work across nationalities and cultures, enhancing the commitment to fight against fake news and to create a more responsible society, where young people cannot be misled by false propaganda or hatred.

The activity will be based around media literacy and fake news in the youth sector. The activity intends to deepen the participants' understanding of fake news, media literacy, and critical thinking. They will have the opportunity to develop ideas in an open environment through interactive sessions, discussions, exercises, group work and presentations.

Activity Programme

Attached to this Call of Participants is the draft programme of the activity. Please note that some changes may occur in the programme. We are happy to receive your suggestions for improvements and bring on board your contributions.

Follow-up Activities

Participants are expected to organize at least one follow-up activity in their own country after the Training Course to disseminate all the results of the activity. The activity will be conducted by the usage of non-formal education methods which were presented during the Training Course. The target group of the follow-up activity is youth workers who are interested in media from outside and inside of the organisation of the project partner. This activity must have taken place before the A2 – Seminar (2 December 2021).

Participants' profile

To participate in the activity, the candidates must fulfil the following requirements:

- 1) Age at least 18
- 2) Be a youth worker
- 3) Have the ability to utilise the experience and knowledge they got during the training course in their daily work with young people
- 4) Have motivation to participate actively during the whole training course
- 5) Have an interest in the world of media
- 6) Have full command of English
- 7) Have availability to participate for the whole duration of the activity.

Candidates who do not fulfil the above requirements will not be accepted.

Application and selection procedure

The partner organisations are responsible to nominate participants for the activity. The nominated participants shall complete an application form on the following link: <http://intercollege.info/application-keep-it-real-tc> no later than **10 September 2021**. Confirmation of the participants selection will be announced by the organisers **16 September 2021**.

Within **5 days** after the selection results are announced, participants must confirm their participation in the activity by providing proof that they have purchased their tickets with a copy of the invoice and a copy of the e-ticket.

Travel Budget

The EU contribution for the travel expenses per participant is as follows (per person):

*Distances were calculated with the [distance calculator](#) of the European Commission from the location of each sending organisation to the venue.

Participants shall be reimbursed for their travel expenses up to the amount available for their countries and no more than their real costs.

Should the travel expenses exceed the contribution available, participants shall cover the extra costs from own resources.

Participation in the activity is free of charge.

Visa

The partner organizations are responsible for ensuring that the selected participants have their visa in case it is required to travel to Denmark. The partner organizations must ensure that the visa application procedure is started in good time. Upon request the organisers can provide an invitation letter to help with the visa application. The available budget for visa is 90€/participant from Turkey.

Please keep all the receipts and documentation regarding the visa application.

Travel Insurance

Participants must have a travel insurance covering them for the whole duration of the activity. It is strongly advised that the travel insurance covers the participants' costs for an eventual Covid-19 treatment and similar expenses.

COVID-19 – Entry Requirements

Denmark classifies regions and countries around the world in four categories: green, yellow, orange and red.
