
## ACCOMMODATION

# ABOUT BITOLA

Bitola is located in the southwestern part of the country, 14 km from the Greek border, on an elevation of around 600m above the sea level. It has about 80.000 inhabitants and the majority are Orthodox Christians. Bitola is known as the city of consuls, due to the great significance of the city during the Ottoman Empire. Bitola is also called "The city of piano" especially for the aristocracy that used to live in it. Its image was changing as the history was writing stories on its soil. Bitola is connected to the name of the well known Turkish reformer Mustafa Kemal Atatürk where he finished the Military Academy, and today the building is the seat of the National Museum.

One of the most beautiful archaeological sites in Macedonia, Heraclea Lyncestis, is the most visited attraction in this city. In Bitola you can experience the different historical periods, you can feel the atmosphere of the famous pedestrian and always crowded street Shirok Sokak and enjoy the beautiful and authentic architecture, which will leave you speechless.



# HOW TO REACH BITOLA



#### **ARRIVING AT SKOPJE**

Skopje Airport Is located 150 km from Bitola. Here is how to reach Bitola form the airport:

·Skopje Airport – Skopje shuttle <a href="https://www.wtransporter.com/">https://www.wtransporter.com/</a> Price of the ticket 199 MKD (3,22 EUR). Ride time to Skopje 30 min.

·When you arrive at main bus station in Skopje you have to get a bus to Bitola. You cannot book online so you have to buy the ticket at the station. If you travel to and back from Skopje, we recommend to buy a return ticket.

If you find a better connection to the Thessaloniki airport you can then find a bus to reach Florina where a member of our team will pick you up. How to reach Florina:


The bus route 01X provides direct connectivity from Thessaloniki Airport to the "Macedonia" Intercity Bus Station (KTEL) in Thessaloniki. (<a href="https://thessaloniki-skg-">https://thessaloniki-skg-</a>

Frequency and Timings: The bus 01X operates from 6:10 am to 10:40 pm, running every 20-25 minutes. It runs 2 to 3 times per hour, 7 days a week.

Journey Duration: The journey to the city center takes approximately 40 minutes, and reaching the final stop (KTEL Station) takes about 50-55 minutes.

Bus Stop Location at the Airport: The bus stop is situated at the departures area, in front of entrance 3 of Terminal 1. Night Service: For late evening, night, and early morning travel, bus 1N operates between the airport and the KTEL station from 22:00 hours to 04:45 hours.

# TRAVEL DISTANCE AND BUDGET BY COUNTRY

#### **GREEN TRAVEL**

The Erasmus+ programme offers Green Travel Support for people travelling to their destination using sustainable modes of transport. Examples of sustainable means of transport are: cycling, carpooling, the bus or the train. To qualify for Green Travel Support, you must use sustainable means of transport for most of your journey (outward and return).

Green Travel Support is available if your destination lies within 100 km to 4000 km travel distance. If you receive Green Travel Support, you will receive a higher travel allowance than the standard travel allowance.

Participants from Greece and Serbia are expected to use the green travel on the project and will receive a higher travel budget.



# TRAVEL DISTANCE AND BUDGET BY COUNTRY

#### REIMBURSMENT

The organizers will reimburse your travel costs from your home city to Bitola, N. Macedonia and back based on the above table. Reimbursement of travel costs will only be done upon full attendance in the project program and presentation of the original tickets.

Based on the travel distance per participant check the amount that are cover by Erasmus+ Any costs above the lump sum (flat rate) represents your own contribution.

All participants are required to purchase health insurance.

Reimbursement will be done by BANK after receiving all original travel document by post and fulfilling the dissemination requirements.


# WEATHER



The temperatures in Bitola in April are quite cold with **temperatures between 5°C and 14°C**, warm clothes are a must.

You can expect about **3 to 8 days of rain** in Bitola during the month of April. It's a good idea to bring along your umbrella so that you don't get caught in poor weather.

Please note that Bitola can expect a few days of snow in April.



# FINAL PREPARATIONS

- Intercultural evening –The intercultural evening gives you a unique opportunity in a creative way to promote your country and culture. Show us what you eat, drink, what are your traditions, music, dance..
- NGO Market The project will include a session when you will present your organizations and you will have time to prepare a flipchart presentation. Feel free to bring promotional materials of your organization to share with the others.
- Morning/Afternoon Energizers: We would be really happy if you prepare some energizers to increase the group energy
- The hotel provides towels but we would recommend that you bring your own toiletries, medicine, shower slippers, etc. anything you need for personal hygiene.
- The currency in N.Macedonia is the Denar (MKD). 1 EURO = 61,5 MKD. It is recommended to bring some euros with you so you can exchange it with denars, as not every place accepts card payments.


# ABOUT OUR CULTURE
